### Classroom Items:

# Arabic Studies

This term children in year 2 will focus on the Arabic names of items found within a classroom. The prepositions 'above' and 'below' will also be introduced to enable children to start taking the first steps towards constructing sentences. Arabic numbers 0 - 10 will be consolidated with children learning how to count the classroom items.

# Music – Listening and Composting

Children will be learning to sing and perform a Nasheed called Subhanallah with a good sense of pulse and rhythm. Children will learn the structure of the song and explore singing at different speeds and pitch to create moods and feelings. They will discover how to use the voice to create loud and soft sounds.















**Fundamental movement skills:** The pupils will be developing and improving their Fundamental movement skills through fitness activities. In this unit pupils will take part in a range of activities to develop components of fitness. Pupils will begin to explore and develop agility, balance, co-ordination, speed and stamina. Pupils will be given the opportunity to work independently and with others. Pupils will develop perseverance and show determination to work for longer periods of time. This unit links to the following strands of the NC: master basic movements including running, jumping and throwing. Develop balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities. The pupils will also be learning about Health and Nutrition: How a balanced diet is important and how this may impact on their daily life.

PE

<u>Sending and Receiving:</u> Net and wall games are games where either a net separates the players or a wall is used. The object is to hit the ball over the net and into the court space or against a wall to make it difficult for a partner to return. Examples include tennis, badminton, volleyball, squash. In this unit, pupils develop their understanding of attacking and defending principles in net games such as using a ready position to defend their court and placement of a ball into space.
