## CURRICULUM NEWSLETTER YEAR 2 - Summer 2

Please find below the units that your child will be learning this term.

English Narrative Writing – Writing an adventure story based on the book The Pirate Cruncher • Punctuation – Using a range of punctuation including question marks, exclamation marks, commas and apostrophes. • Grammar - nouns, pronouns, verbs, imperative verbs prepositions, conjunctions, expanded noun phrases • Spellings – adding -ed, -er and -est to a word ending in -y, adding -ing to a word ending in -y with a consonant before it, Adding –ing, -ed, -er,-est and –y to words ending in -e with a consonant before it, Adding –ing, -ed, -er,-est and –y of one syllable ending in a single	Reading Focus Texts: The Pirate Cruncher and a range of different texts including fiction, nonfiction and poetry • I can decode automatically and fluently. • I can discuss the sequence of events in books and how they relate to each other. • I can answer and ask questions about the text. • I can draw (simple) inferences from illustrations, events, characters' actions and speech.

Science Plants • Use the local environment to observe how different plants grow. • An introduction to the requirements of plants for germination, growth and survival, as well as the processes of reproduction and growth in plants. • Work scientifically by: observing and recording, with some accuracy, the growth of a variety of plants as they change over time from a seed or bulb, or observing similar plants at different stages of growth; setting up a comparative test to show that plants need light and water to stay healthy. • Dissect, plants, flowers, seeds and bulbs to understand the different parts and their functions • Learn that Allah is the One who causes plants to grow.
<b>Computing – Word Processing</b> In this unit, the children will learn basic typing and word processing skills. Children will learn how to type with two hands, use the shift, space and enter key properly, and edit work by using the backspace, delete and arrow keys. Children will then go on to learn how to use undo and redo and to select and format text. This will support children when they type their final draft of their narrative in writing. # The pupils will be learning all about how to play lots of Invasion games and earn lots of new skills participating in Net and Wall games

Invasion Games / Mixed ball games: Invasion games are games where there are two teams and two goals. Teams try to score in the opposition's goal. Examples include football, handball, rugby, netball, basketball, hockey. in this unit, pupils develop their understanding of the principles of defending and attacking for invasion games. They use and develop skills such as sending and receiving with both feet and hands, as well as dribbling with both feet and hands. They have the opportunity to play uneven and even sided games. They learn how to score points in these types of games and learn to play to the rules.

**Net & Wall Games:** Net and wall games are games where either a net separates the players or a wall is used. The object is to hit the ball over the net and into the court space or against a wall to make it difficult for a partner to return. Examples include tennis, badminton, volleyball, squash. In this unit, pupils develop their understanding of attacking and defending principles in net games such as using a ready position to defend their court and placement of a ball into space. They use and develop skills such as throwing, catching, tracking and hitting a ball. They learn how to score points and how to play to the rules. They work independently, with a partner and in a small group and begin to self-manage their own games, showing respect and kindness towards their teammates and opponents.

#### Music – Singing

Children will be learning to sing and perform a sea shanty.

Singing:

Sing new repertoire increasingly in tune within a limited pitch range. Perform songs, chants and rhymes with a good sense of pulse and rhythm

Listening:

Build an understanding of the pulse and internalise it when listening to a piece of music

### **Additional Information**

<u>Trip</u>: This year's trip is to Painshill Park on <u>Wednesday 16th July 2025</u> as part of an experience day to meet a variety of animals. All children must wear the school uniform and sensible walking shoes.
