Cross Curricular: Reading: Tutankhamun's Tomb- I was there.

Develop subject knowledge, structure and vocabulary.

NC Objectives:

Chronological Understanding

Knowledge and Interpretation

Review: I can appreciate that the early Brits would not have communicated as we do or have eaten as we do.

This term:

- I can recognise that Britain has been invaded by several different groups over time.
- I can explain how people who lived in the past cooked and travelled differently and used different weapons from ours.
- I can begin to appreciate why Britain would have been an important country to have invaded and conquered.

Historical Enquiry

Review: I can appreciate how historical artefacts have helped us understand more about British lives in the present and past.

This term:

- I can use various sources to piece together information about a period in history.
- I can use my information finding skills in writing to help them write about historical information.

Cross Curricular: Writing:
