YEAR 6 – SPRING 1 - The Battle of Britain? (History)

History NC Objectives

Chronological understanding:

- -Place specific events on a timeline by decade
- -Place features of historical events and people from past societies and periods in chronological framework

Knowledge and interpretation:

- -summarise what Britain has learnt from other countries and civilisations through time gone by and more recently
- -Summarise the main events from a specific period in history, explaining the order in which key events took place.
- -describe features of historical events and people from past societies and periods studied

Educational Visit:

Music:

Pupils will be learning about soundscapes and layering the sounds of the Battle of Britain.

Science: Light

Pupils will recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines and use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye

They will explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes. In addition, they will use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.
