(History)

Cross Curricular: Writing:

Narrative based on historical settings
Discussion linked to crime and punishment
Journalistic writing linked to Henry the VIII

NC Objectives:

- Plan their writing by discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar
- In non-narrative material, using simple organisational devices [for example, headings and sub-headings]
- Organising paragraphs around a theme
- Proposing changes to grammar and vocabulary to improve consistency, including the accurate use of pronouns in sentences

NC Objectives:

- Design purposeful, functional, appealing products for themselves and other users based on design criteria
- Select from and use a range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks [for example, cutting, shaping, joining and finishing]
- Evaluate their ideas and products against design criteria
- Build structures, exploring how they can be made stronger, stiffer and more stable

History NC Objectives:

Chronological understanding

- Place historical periods in a chronological framework
- Use historical terms related to the period of history
